

### SPRING SALAD

1 pkg lemon jello 1 cup boiling water 1 cup chopped celery 1/4 cup chopped cucumber

1/4 cup chopped onion (sweet) 1/4 cup grated carrots (optional) 1 cup mayonnaise 1 cup cottage cheese. small curd

When jello starts to set, beat with fork until foamy. Add mayonnaise and beat again. Add cottage cheese and mix well. Add remaining ingredients. Stir together and chill. Use 8-inch square cake pan. Serves 12-16.
